Bill Jensen, 32, associate editor at *The Boston Phoenix*. **READ ALL ABOUT IT:** Last month, the *Phoenix* introduced a new look and a new leader, Jensen, from the *Long Island Press*, who takes over managing news and features for the free alternative weekly in Boston. "I'm so excited to come back to a young city." **HEAVEN CAN WAIT:** Jensen attended Boston University, where he studied classics and religion. "I was on the path to be an academic," he says.
